



Held on Tuesday 13th January, we were joined by Cllr. Amanda Robinson, Sandra Rees, Community Safety and Safeguarding manager, and Pc Dave Isaac, our local officer.

For the first part of the meeting we were joined by SBC members Steve Wilson, Forward Planning Manager, David Hand, Snr Planning Officer and Andrew Rowe, Housing Manager.

Between them they introduced the next phase in the process relating to the Local Plan, and specifically the concerns expressed by members of our group about Houses in Multiple Occupation (HMO's) and the consultation process connected to the drafting of the Supplementary Planning Document (SPD)

They all took questions from members, and Andrew dealt with specific about the licensing and management controls of HMO's

In the second part Sandra Rees talked about her role and in particular issues surrounding anti-social behaviour in its broadest context.

University Update

You may already have heard this update about the University and Scarborough, but if not...

SBC announced on 4th February the location of the site for the development of the Coventry University. It will be co-located with the new Leisure Village Development on the site of the old Park and Ride in Weaponness Valley.

The site will comprise the new Football Stadium, swimming pool and leisure facilities and will also house the Coventry University and Scarborough UTC.

The proposed site plans are going to be on view at the Falsgrave Community Centre on Friday 6th February (1600 - 2000) and Saturday 7th (1000 – 14.30)
